

# A message from our Administrator

What a friend we have in Jesus, as our prayers have been answered with the reduction of the spread of COVID-19 in our facility and community. As of this writing we are still in 'outbreak status', however, we are hopeful to soon be back to a 'Phase I status'. Going back to 'Phase 1 status', we will see many positive changes – such as being able to schedule outdoor family visits. As the

weather is changing, we are also working on inside visits.

We will be welcoming back our hairdresser, Linda, as well as the ability to accept food from certified kitchens. Once again, we will be able to deliver to your loved one any boughten items you drop off. Restorative Therapy resumed on October 1, and we are working to develop our resident's strength to improve their lives.

We did have another exposure with a family member coming in for a compassionate visit. This family member did not have any symptoms but was being tested for their work the same day as having their visit; unfortunately the test was positive. We are monitoring this exposure very closely however it is pushing our opportunity to get out of 'outbreak status' to 'Phase 1 status' until October 8.

Over the past month or so we have had to make many residents move in order to keep unaffected residents safe from getting the virus. We are so sorry we needed to do this. We had more than 54 resident moves. We had to create a new COVID unit from our F wing to our G wing. Our G wing now has been completely cleaned, waxed, painted and we have begun to move residents back into this unit. I want to commend all of our staff for all of this work; it was not easy and yet it had to be done to be done for our residents. Thank you!

We will continue to test our staff on a weekly basis. This testing schedule will only change if the county numbers rise or fall. If they do increase, we will have to do two tests per week like we were doing before. If they decrease, we can go to one testing per month.

It is hard to imagine that over a year ago we switched from a quarterly newsletter to a monthly newsletter. We made that switch so we could better communicate

with all families and residents on a more regular basis. We are again making another change and we want to communicate with more family members by making sure we get your email address. We would like to email as many newsletters as possible to keep as many family members informed as possible. This change is more effective for us and cost effective. We realize that not everyone has email, and we will send you a hard copy if you are the main contact. We are also launching a new website and it should be up and running by November 1. This will provide you with more information, activities, menus, etc., and even the opportunity to send a e-card to your loved one.

Reminder to all families... we have recently sent out consent forms about having your loved one get a flu shot and a pneumonia shot. Shots will be given at the end of this month, so please respond as soon as possible. Doctors recommend that all residents and staff get a flu shot. Flu alone leads to 200,000 hospitalizations and about 36,000 deaths nationwide each year. We have a compromised population here that needs to be protected as much as possible... so get the flu shot and the pneumonia shot.

As always, we hope everything is going well for all our residents. Our staff works hard to ensure all our residents are well cared for, comfortable, and as happy as possible. However, if you do have a concern, please let Diana, Brianna or I know about it as soon as possible. We cannot fix something we if we do not know about it. Once we are aware of the concern, we will address it immediately and make every effort to correct it.

# Thank you for your support

When Aase Haugen was declared as a COVID19 outbreak facility on August 21, 2020, a whirlwind experience we that we had been planning for and praying would never arrive took shape. We went into full protective mode, like a mamma with her cubs. Everyone laced up in personal protective equipment (PPE or gowns, masks, gloves, face shields, etc.) and we became laser focused on quarantining, isolating, comforting, caring and providing compassion for our residents. It was a scary time for some, and a troubling time for others. Staff quickly moved residents from one side of the building to another based on their testing positive or negative, or if they were showing symptoms of COVID19. We experienced 26 residents becoming

ill from the virus and 19 staff. It was heartbreaking and bittersweet as we cheered for the 20 residents and staff who recovered, but cried as we lost five residents during this same time. Four of those losses were contributed to COVID19. As this newsletter goes to press, we are close to the 28th day of reporting negative tests for all residents and staff. Once we reach the 28 day milestone, our testing requirements change for the better. We have been tested, we have engaged our faith, and we have passed through this storm. Thank you to any one who remembered us, gave us food, provided words of encouragement, prayed for us; we are forever grateful.

## Words of Encouragement

Dear Orson and employees at Aase Haugen Home.

I don't have to tell you how scary it is to be working in a nursing home with active Covid-19 cases. Some days you have to force yourself to go to work. It's easy to feel burned out. You worry about bringing Covid home. You may know some residents very well and have grown very close to them. It really hurts to see them sick, and in some cases, die. It's like family. I want to know that you are very brave, and all our community knows what you are up against and think and pray for you frequently. You are always so professional when interacting with residents and families.

I had the great opportunity to practice in Decorah my whole medical career as a family physician. I would make regular rounds at Aase Haugen. I got to know my patients over time if I did not already know them from before. Those relationships meant everything. You are much closer than I as you are there every day. Every one of you is critical to make Aase Haugen function. Your residents depend on you.

It is so tough when someone you love dies. Remember, all that you can do is the best you can do. You cannot fix the ravages of aging, or all of their illnesses. If they are dying, you can make their death as good as possible. Make sure they are comfortable, hold their hand. No one wants to be alone.

My grandparents both stayed at Aase until their deaths, and my mother will as well. I have always been thankful for the good care they got.

Aase Haugen herself was alone facing a cancer death. That is why she donated money to establish the home. We are, in a sense, all family at the end. We hope Covid can be driven out, but that is very difficult. Just do the best you can every day. We think of you and pray for you and the residents every day.
